- Bring your organization's issues to NYSCEA business meeting.
- Register for meetings and ensure member association dues are paid.
- Disseminate NYSCEA information to your organization's membership.
- Provide your organization information to NYSCEA Executive Manager.
- Utilize technological communications, including list-serve and NYSCEA website.

Membership Eligibility

To be eligible for consideration as a member of the Council, a professional organization must provide evidence that it sustains a major interest in statewide policy for strengthening the quality of education, and, that a majority of its members are teachers, supervisors, administrators, and other professionals in the schools and colleges of New York State. Any organization seeking membership on the Council shall give evidence that it is not an umbrella group consisting of any current member organizations currently represented in NYSCEA.
